More recent books include *The Global Debate over Constitutional Property: Lessons for American Takings Jurisprudence and Property and Community* (with Eduardo M. Peñalver). He is co-author of the most widely used property casebook in the United States (with James Krier and Michael Schill). Eduardo M. Peñalver is a Professor of Law at Cornell University, New York.
